OUR COVID-19 UPDATES

NATIONAL LOCKDOWN: Only outdoor visits are allowed.

(FROM MONDAY 4TH JANUARY)

We are continuing to follow government guidance, monitor the spread of the virus on a national scale, and assess the risk to our residents. We still recognise how important visits are for residents and for you and we know you all miss each other very much. We are doing all we can to keep spirits high and maintain a positive, happy home despite the circumstances.

Outdoor visits

Please arrive half an hour before your appointment to allow for lateral flow testing.

Outdoor visits are now taking place by means of our visiting pods or window visits. Please speak to the home manager for more details and to book an appointment. Outdoor visits must follow all the '['covid-secure' regulations](#)'. Our residents are looking forward to seeing their loved ones in person. Thank you for your patience & understanding as we continue to keep your loved ones as safe as possible. If there is a suspected positive case in the home – all visits will cease.

Indoor Visits

Please arrive half an hour before you're appointment to allow for lateral flow testing.

Indoor visits may be available for residents who are receiving end of life care. All visitors will require lateral flow testing and the time this takes to perform needs to be factored into your visiting time. If there is a suspected positive case in the home – all visits will cease.

Our homes are 'COVID-secure'.

Only outdoor visits are currently available. Please read the document on the following two pages which give more details and outline the 9 steps you will need to follow for a successful visit using our external visiting pods or huts. Lateral flow testing will be carried out on all visitors.

Vaccinations - already starting in our homes

The Home manager or a senior member of staff will be in touch, if they haven't already, to ensure all consents are in place for residents to receive the vaccine.

Keeping our residents and staff safe continues to be our number one priority. When it comes to visits, we are considering all the options open to us to provide safe and meaningful visits in our homes. Please contact your home manager for more information.



UPDATES TO VISITING OUR HOME (LAST UPDATED: 30.01.21)

TIERS, VISITS & DURATION OF RESTRICTIONS

OUR HOME IS IN:

NATIONAL LOCKDOWN

WHICH MEANS:

ALL VISITS MUST BE OUTDOORS
(PODS / WINDOW VISITS ONLY)

There are still ways to keep in touch.

We know how hard it is to be apart from the ones you love.

Please don't forget you can still contact your loved one by picking up the phone, or arranging a video call with them. We are so grateful that we can still do our best to keep you in touch with your loved ones throughout this crisis.

Please know we always have your loved one's welfare in mind and our staff are sacrificing seeing their family to be there for yours.

We are in a **NATIONAL LOCKDOWN**. The following measures are being recommended for care homes by local councils as well as the Care Quality Commission and NHS.

We are closely monitoring the spread of the pandemic on both a national and local level and taking the necessary precautions as well following the latest government guidance to keep your loved ones safe.

Please respect our decision and if you have any questions, speak to the manager who will be able to give you more details.

CURRENT RESTRICTIONS:

Outdoor & Window Visits Only: visits to care homes can take place with arrangements such as substantial screens, visiting pods, or behind windows.

PLEASE ARRIVE HALF AN HOUR BEFORE YOUR APPOINTMENT TIME TO ALLOW FOR LATERAL FLOW TESTING.

No indoor visiting: our residents will not be able to leave the premises to visit loved ones and relatives will not be able to visit inside the home.

Indoor visits may be allowed under exceptional circumstances, such as those receiving end of life care. Please contact the home manager for more information.

Duration: Lockdown restrictions are in effect until government guidelines state otherwise.

9 STEPS TO A SUCCESSFUL COVID-SECURE VISIT



STEP 1

AN APPOINTMENT SYSTEM MUST BE FOLLOWED

Book a visiting time and **arrive 30 minutes before** to allow for [LFD Testing](#).



STEP 2

UP TO TWO CONSTANT VISITORS PER RESIDENT

Contact your home to see whether one or two visitors are permitted.



STEP 3

LATERAL FLOW TESTING IS AVAILABLE FOR ALL VISITS

We advise all visitors to take a lateral flow test before entering the home.



STEP 4

THE CORRECT PPE MUST BE WORN DURING THE WHOLE VISIT

You will be shown to put on, take off and safely dispose of all PPE correctly.



STEP 5

HAND HYGIENE MUST BE PRACTISED BY ALL VISITORS

Visitors must wash their hands for 20 seconds or use hand sanitiser provided.



STEP 6

2M SOCIAL DISTANCING MUST BE PRACTICED

Visitors must keep 2mtrs apart from residents and staff where possible.



STEP 7

REMAIN IN THE INDOOR OR EXTERNAL VISITING AREA AT ALL TIMES

Indoor visits are at the discretion of the manager. Please respect their decision.



STEP 8

SUBSTANTIAL SCREENS MUST BE IN PLACE

Please do not touch the safety screens and always maintain social distancing.



STEP 9

WATCH FOR SYMPTOMS AFTER YOUR VISIT

Notify us immediately if you develop symptoms not long after your visit.

STEPS WE ARE TAKING TO KEEP OUR HOME COVID-SECURE FOR VISITS



INFECTION CONTROL MEASURES, RISK ASSESSMENTS & VISITING PLANS ARE IN PLACE

We are ensuring our protocols keep everyone safe as well as focus on the individual needs of our residents. We are conducting training and adopting stringent infection control measures.



RESIDENTS & STAFF ARE TESTED REGULARLY

Care home staff are tested up to three times a week, all on the same day and at the same time, including bank and agency staff. Residents are tested every 28 days.



PPE SUPPLIES ARE WELL-STOCKED & REGULARLY MONITORED

All of our homes are well stocked with PPE supplies. The government's new PPE portal which focuses on providing the needed supplies to the care sector has helped, and supply numbers are regularly monitored.



OUR HOMES

We're all getting our vaccines.

We are happy to announce that vaccinations are taking place throughout our homes! Grasmere received the AstraZeneca Covid19 vaccination in January. Everyone at Grasmere wanted to say a big thank you to Dr Wimbush and Dr Jones from Old Court House Surgery.
