They also help reduce loneliness and agitation in care home residents. (They are also considerably easier to look after!)





ROADMAP OUT OF LOCKDOWN STEP 3 SUMMARY (17TH MAY)

Residents can have up to 5 named visitors

- Test at Home (if you can) to speed up the visiting process
- Only visitors of the same household or bubble can visit at the same time

A resident can go on an outing with a loved one

- All outings must be outside
- Risk Assessments are needed for each outing
- One person can accompany the resident on the outing - no groups
